
There are two rule changes this year. The first is a 100 Watt power limit for all stations. This should even the playing field. The second is the addition of Class D home stations. Why do we enjoy Ham Radio so much?

I have pondered this question several times over the years. I have been looking for, and now believe, there is identified a credible reason most Hams may consider to provide an honest answer for this basic question. It identifies how our interest, enthusiasm to peruse understanding, and desire effective results within a technical art. It is known and been published as "Radio Sloyd".

The word "sloyd" derives from the Swedish "Sloyd," meaning "handy." Educational Sloyd, beginning mid-19th century Finland, is a system of general education that initially centered on woodworking. The term is from Finnish word "slojd" meaning craft or manual skill. Finnish educator, Uno Cignaeus, originated the program, which spread to Sweden, the UK, and then to the United States in the early 1900's. The intent was to "craft" education to systematically teach mental, physical, and moral development.



A system of elementary education was based on paper model building. Today, Sloyd continues as a compulsory educational program in Sweden, with educational goals including personal management, ability to create and to use materials, and cultural and aesthetic expression.

Educational Sloyd was a response that improved a teaching style involving a lecturing teacher at the front of a classroom and perhaps not very much more. "French philosopher Jean Jacques Rousseau said, 'the great secret to enhance learning is to combine mental and physical work so that one kind of exercise refreshes the other.'

Here is an example on how “Radio Sloyd” extends beyond normal book learning and applies to many of us enjoying Ham Radio. Consider a Field Day event. We will need to address at least some of the following challenges beyond just being a licensed amateur operator;

Electronics: The radio isn’t working right. How do we fix it?

Electromagnetics: What kind of antennas do we use? Where do they go?

Process Engineering: How do we pack and unpack our equipment? How are they moved?

Management: What are our objectives? What is the operating schedule? How to we count the score?

Marketing: How do we advertise the event? What do we do get interested Hams to join us?

Archery: What is the best way to place the wire antenna between the trees?

Woodworking: How are we going to get the antenna down?



A practical example of the Radio Sloyd use is the design and introduction of the Atwater Kent Model 35 radio receiver. It features single tuning dial for simplified operation, a sleek polished wood case, and improved sound speaker (not shown in photo). It was a popular radio during the 1920's in many homes. The single dial was “handy” to tune stations making it very easy to use.

For a successful Field Day, these skills may be very important to have, even though our focus is technically operating the Ham radio equipment. It is through this kind of practice that we cultivate our capabilities as both radio operators and problem solvers. To excel at either requires matters both technical and otherwise. That would be to break problems down into manageable parts, and to build on existing systems and creativity. This results with our enjoyment being Ham operators while learning new expertise.

To be in a word, handy.

The expenditures continue, and unfortunately increase.

In the words of Harry Callahan, "I know what you're thinking." We have a substantial treasury, why not just spend what we have. We do. We pay for the picnic. We pay for Field Day. We pay the service fee for the internet at the repeater. We pay for refreshments at the meetings. We just appropriated funds for the Wires-X equipment that will further enhance our repeater. My request to you, the CARS members, is simple. Come up with an idea. No work involved; just tickle your brain a bit. We will discuss the subject at future meetings. In the meantime, if the lightbulb above your head goes off, contact me with your thoughts. Call me, email me, text me, or whatever. As always, a note tied to a rock thrown through my front window is always acceptable.
